Campus Stabilization

Part of our ONE initiative was Campus Stabilization. The campus needs were diverse. From upgrading sound systems to constructing entire Worship Centers, God provided miraculous solutions to some serious challenges. Here's where we stand after two years of intentional focus on Campus Stabilization.



Anderson

After a strong first year of planting, the Anderson Campus entered the One Initiative praying for a permanent location to call home. Thankfully, after two years of setting up and tearing down in the ballroom of a hotel, God provided a permanent campus location through a merger with Orville Baptist Church. This multibuilding, 2.5 acre property provides a great missional opportunity for our Anderson Campus to be involved with the community.



Harrison Bridge

Even with three morning worship services, the 200-seat Worship Center at the Harrison Bridge Campus has been maxed out for some time. A new 400-seat Worship Center was part of our ONE initiative from the very beginning. We felt there was no better picture of our cross-campus unity than making this substantial missional investment in the future of the community that surrounds UCHB. We're so excited that they are worshiping in their new space TODAY for the very first time! The old worship center will be renovated into additional Kids spaces, freeing up space for our growing Student ministry.



Haywood

Our hopes were to have completed the renovations to our Haywood Campus by the spring of 2024. Unfortunately, the process has taken much longer than anticipated. Sensing the leading of the Lord, we made the decision to move forward in the mission, refusing to allow permits and other restrictions to hold back the progress of expansion. We pivoted toward a renovation of the existing Worship Center with paint, carpet, chairs, lighting, and shades for the stained glass windows. The next step will be to continue renovating current spaces for our ever-growing Kids ministry! The original plan is still in place to renovate the gym for a larger worship space, but we are able to continue growing in the meantime.

Simpsonville Campus

While not as wildly evident as other campuses, work has been going on at our Downtown Simpsonville Campus. Over the past two years we've made extensive upgrades to both the audio system and the HVAC system in the Worship Center. The Vintage 111 building also received some much needed upgrades, providing additional office space. We also remodeled much of the 'E' building as well as recently replacing the roofing of the Family Life Center. We were able to convert two existing church properties into housing for the participants in our Resident Program. In addition, we have been, and continue to, explore options for lasting facilities improvement for our Historic Chapel.

Five Forks

God has continued to richly bless our Five Forks Campus with growth in every area. We've worked hard to get creative in our efforts to accommodate the increase in kids and students, acquiring an additional leased space for weekly groups. We've continued to search for a new permanent home for the campus, with no success. There is simply a shortage of commercial property for purchase or rent in that area of explosive population growth. In recent days we have begun searching for new options we previously considered impossible. Please be praying for wisdom and direction in the coming months, as we are certain God will soon open new doors of opportunity that will lift the lid and allow us to continue reaching the Five Forks community.

Mauldin

After the main remodel of the Worship Center, Lobby, and Kids Area, we moved onto the Family Life Center. The new FLC has provided a space for Open Gym basketball, league practices and many ways for us to reach the community. We also added a much needed storage facility on the side of the FLC! As Students and Groups grew, we renovated spaces on the second floor and finished renovations in summer 2023.

Hillcrest

Laurens County has always been on our radar for a future expansion, but it was not in our immediate plans. God made it clear in 2023 that we were to come alongside a church of faithful believers in Laurens, merging to pursue a missional future together. While the details are unclear, one thing is certain. God has a plan, and we are part of it. We will begin to focus more of our attention on the work in Laurens County at the beginning of 2024. Listen out for details, and pray to ask the Lord if he's calling you to join in on this missional adventure.
